

COLOURS

THERE ARE MANY WAYS TO TEACH KIDS ABOUT COLOURS. BUT FIRST, THINK OF THE IDEAS THAT CAN HELP THEM TAKE NOTICE OF THE COLOURS AROUND THEM.

ON AN A3 SHEET OF PAPER,

draw six boxes and label the names of various colours (as above) in their corresponding colours. Place it in a clear plastic bag. Next, line up a row of Play-Doh compound balls in all the colours you have printed and ask your kids to match them to the boxes. This way, kids get to learn about colours and how to recognise the spelling of each.

TO ENCOURAGE A

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

ONCE KIDS KNOW THE LETTERS OF THE ALPHABET BY HEART, TEACH THEM HOW TO SPELL.

For older kids, use the letters made with Play-Doh compound to form simple words. Start with three-letter words and progress to four-letter ones. Having to knead, roll and form the shapes of the letters and words will help your child remember them.


READING

BEFORE ANY CHILD CAN START TO READ, HE NEEDS TO KNOW THE ALPHABET. GETTING THE BASICS DOWN IS VERY IMPORTANT IN THIS PROCESS.

- 1 PRINT OUT THE** alphabet in both capital and small letters – on a piece of A3 paper – and place it in a clear plastic bag. Use these “playmats” again and again, as Play-Doh compound won’t stick to the plastic.
- 2 MOULD EACH LETTER** with rolls of Play-Doh compound according to the alphabet on the print-out. Using these as tracing guides, teach kids the shape of each letter.
- 3 TRY A MATCHING** game that will teach the young ones the capital and small letters of the alphabet. Using bits of Play-Doh compound, roll out the capital letters and small letters, and get the kids to match them up.
- 4 USING THE LETTERS** moulded from Play-Doh compound, teach the alphabet with pictures from magazine cut-outs, print material or objects made from Play-Doh compound. (For example, if the letter is A, show an apple or an ant with it.)



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WHAT AM I?

Have fun with animals, sea creatures and the alphabet.



Using different-coloured Play-Doh compounds, encourage your kids to use as many letters of the alphabet to create various animals they might see at the zoo, or sea creatures they can find in the ocean. For example, “O” is for owl or octopus. (TIP: Each animal or sea creature needs to begin with different letters of the alphabet.)


